**A LOCAL CANNERY**

Rumors of a cannery in Hermiston have been rampant for many a month but so far none have developed beyond the rumor stage. Now comes the news that the Farm Bureau auxiliary has been giving the question some serious contemplation.

That an opening for such an enterprise actually exists in the community is perhaps emphasized by the fact that several interests have considered the proposition before. The local project produces a wealth of garden stuff every year. Its quality measures up to the best standards and the quantity produced is such as to overflow local and nearby markets.

The auxiliary women are interested primarily in a cannery for home use yet their vision extends to a wider horizon and should succeed meet their initial efforts it is likely that the enterprise might be developed along commercial lines.

The women on the local project have aptly demonstrated their organizing and executive ability. It was through their combined efforts that the cooperative laundry came to develop from an idea into an actual reality. If the cannery idea is similarly boosted with the executive ability of the project women behind it, we predict that it, too, will become a reality.

Further thought on the subject has been provoked by a letter from a Portland man who has worked with a company specializing in organizing cooperative canning factories for growers. The letter was addressed to the Herald. As an answer to his queries, he was advised to make a trip to Hermiston to look over the situation and his visit is likely to develop interesting results.

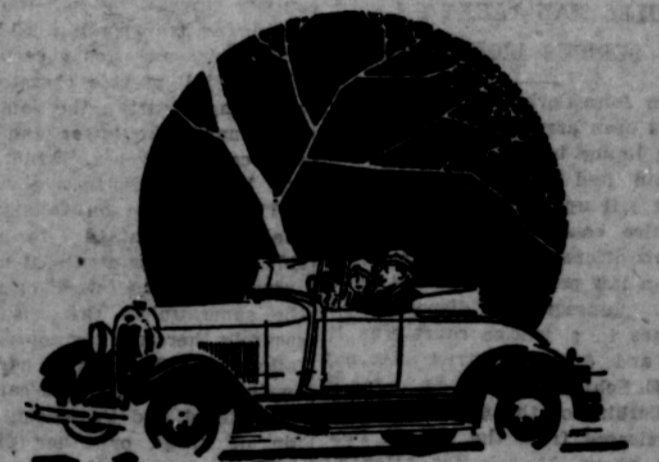
