FACTS ABOUT THE TELEPHONE

Telephotographic service was recently inaugurated between Copenhagen and Berlin.

There was an increase of 83,000,000 telephone calls in Great Britain in 1927 over the figures of 1926.

On April 26, 1929, a radio-telephone service was inaugurated between the Nauen station in Germany and Siam, a distance of 5,300 miles.

About 600,000 dial telephones were placed in operation in 1928, making a total at end of year of 3,500,000, or about 18 per cent of instruments in use in the United States.

A large telephone cable has been laid under the Yackin river in North Carolina which will form part of the link of the cable line now under construction between Washington and Atlanta.

A world telephone exchange has been instituted in Seville, by the International Telephone and Telegraph company. Visitors will be able to telephone from the central office to any of more than 28,000,000 other telephones on three continents.
