**SCHOOL ENROLLMENT IN-
CREASED OVER LAST YEAR**

With the new students that entered the high school during the week the total enrollment is now larger than it was at this time last year, according to Frank Shaw, superintendent. The largest enrollment in the high school last year was 110, while the present attendance is 105.

The elementary enrollment of 205 at the present time exceeds the number enrolled at any time last year. The largest total registration last year was 199.

The increase in the number attending the schools seems to indicate an increased population in Hermiston, according to Mr. Shaw, particularly since the new Adventist school has taken about 28 pupils who would ordinarily attend the Hermiston schools.
