HOSS STARTS WAR AGAINST ONE-EYED, COCK-EYED CARS

Secretary Asks Motorists to Help By Keeping Headlights In Order.

Salem, Oregon, October 1—Hazards of night driving will be considerably lessened during the coming winter months if Secretary of State Hal E. Hoss is successful in his plans to eliminate the "one-eyed" automobile, or cars with only one head light, from Oregon highways.

"There is no excuse for so many cars operating with only one headlight," says Mr. Hoss, "and I am determined to see conditions improved over what they have been. I expect soon to issue general instructions to the state traffic patrol to wage relentless war against the "one-eyed" automobiles, and will ask all sheriffs, town marshalls and other peace officers to cooperate. If reports indicate that it will be necessary to take violators into court, in addition to giving warnings, I will issue orders to that effect. Heretofore violators have gotten off with warnings, but I believe the offense serious enough to justify a fine. A

combination of wet pavement, high speed, and a car with one headlight only, results too often in an accident. Motorists are urged to lend their cooperation in this campaign by keeping both headlights in proper working order."

ALTON HOOKER, U. S. MARINE, GRANTED DIPLOMA FOR WORK
Washington, D. C., October 31—(Special to the Herald)—By combining his military duties with a special course of study, Alton M. Hooker, of Hermiston, Oregon, has been awarded a diploma of proficiency in the farm crops course taught by the Marine Corps Institute of Washington, D. C. He also received a letter from Major General Neville, commander of the marine corps, praising his work as a student.
Hooker, who is now stationed with the 4th Regiment of U. S. Marines in Shanghai, China, joined the sea soldiers at Seattle, Washington, in 1926. Prior to his enlistment he made his home with his father, Henry A. Hooker, rural route 1, Hermiston.
The institute gives free instructions to marines, preparing its students for civilian occupations.
