separation and cause variation in the cream test. So many single factors or combinations of factors affect the richness of the cream that it is extremely difficult to bring them under control sufficiently to produce a cream of uniform richness. The cream producer should check the reliability of his cream buyer by keeping a record of the number of pounds of milk required to yield a definite number of pounds of fat, rather than by judging it according to the fat test of the cream.—Michigan Extension Service.

Medicine in Slot Machines

Medicine is being dispensed by slot machines in London. When the Londoner feels the need of something to cure a cold or to quiet his nerves he drops a coin in a slot machine on the street corner and receives the needed "relief." Machines will soon be ready to supply most any cure from pills to hair tonic. It has been reported.

If You Stutter Try Using Your Left Hand

Los Angeles, Calif.—M-m-m-maybe you s-s-stutter b-b-because you use your r-r-right h-h-hand in-s-s-tead of your l-l-left.

Dr. Milton Metfessel, who is professor of psychology at the University of Southern California, has found that left-handed persons who have become accustomed to using their right hand often stutter.

"If a person is physiologically left-handed—that is, born to use the left hand, either because other people do or because he has been forced to, the mental workings of the patient may be so disturbed as to make him stutter," said Doctor Metfessel today.

He added that some people are not really aware that they are physiologically left-handed, though they seem to use the right easily. He has perfected tests which detect such cases, since the first must make sure whether or not a person has been born left-handed.

"Of course, all left-handed persons do not stutter," said the professor, "and if left-handedness is the cause of their stuttering, it must be treated carefully to prevent a worse condition."

"I'm coming, I'm coming," said Mr. Sun.

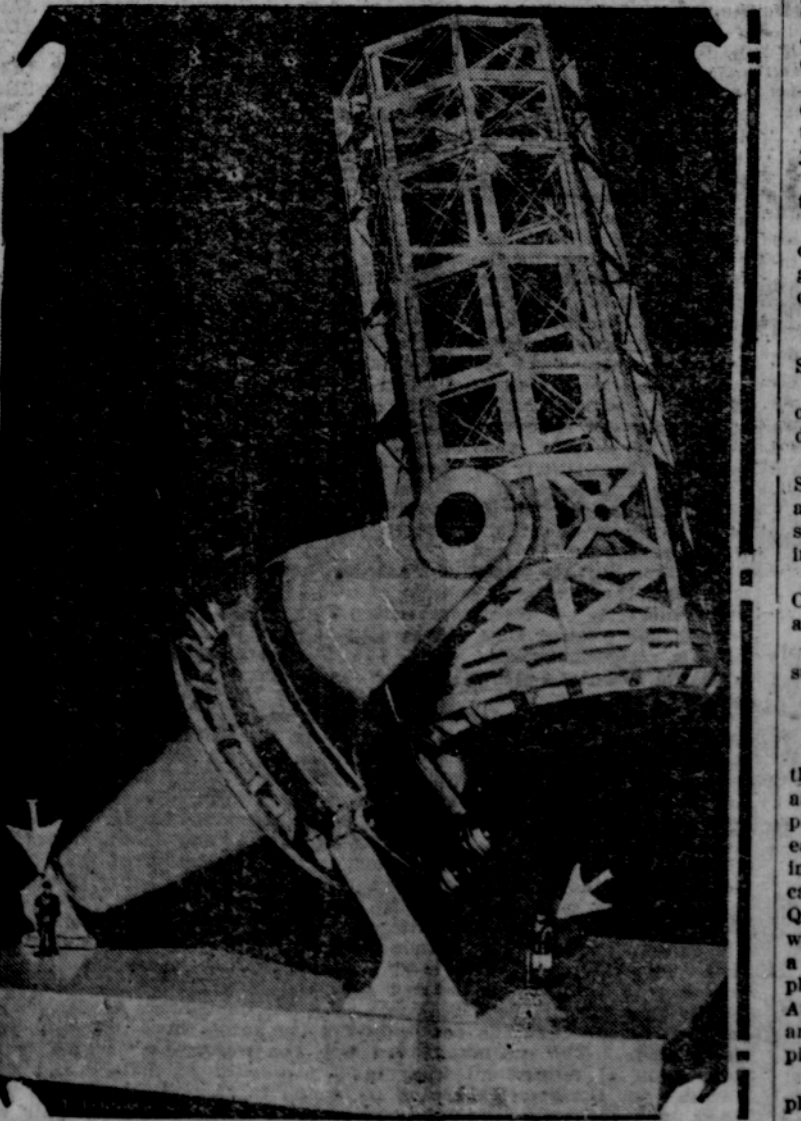
So Mr. Sun followed the wild ducks out into the bay, and then he shone down over the great ocean.

Largest Telescope Is Projected



Here is a rough model of the largest telescope, a reflecting eye penetrating into the reaches of space, that is to be built and put to work in southern California or Arizona. The mirror disk is to be 200 inches in diameter. Details of this epochal forward step in science have been prepared by Dr. George Ellery Hale, honorary director of Mt. Wilson Observatory and chairman of the observatory council of the California Institute of Technology. The human figures by the model give an idea of the size of the telescope.
