## CITY IRRIGATION WATER ASSESSMENT FOR YEAR 1930

District No. 2  
Notice is hereby given that, in accordance with Ordinance No. 96, as amended by Ordinance No. 126, of the City of Hermiston, the City Council of said City has, by ordinance No. 133 entitled "An Ordinance levying an assessment upon the land in City Irrigation District No. 2 for the year 1930," passed by the Council and approved by the Mayor on March

the following lots and parcels of land in said Irrigation District No. 2, established by said Ordinance No. 96 as amended, for the purpose of collecting a special improvement assessment to pay for the cost of water for irrigation and delivery to the said lots and parcels of land, being all the land within said irrigation district, and for constructing and maintaining an irrigation system therefore.

The total cost of the construction and maintenance of the irrigation system is \$425.15; the contract price to be paid the U. S. Government for construction charge is \$131.04; the price to be paid the Hermiston Irrigation District for operation and maintenance is \$74.10; the total amount of the assessment in said District No. 2 is \$630.29.

The assessment is now due and payable at the office of the City Recorder, and if not paid before May 1, 1930 the same shall become delinquent and shall bear interest at the legal rate.
