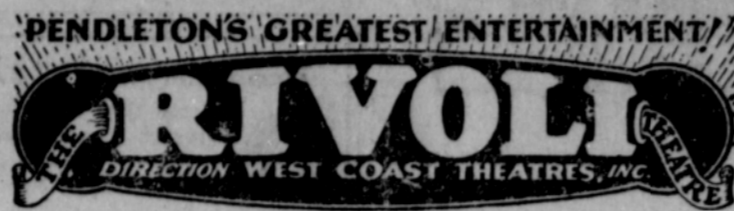
**Returns Much Improved.**

The infant son of Mr. and Mrs. Harry McMillan, of Goldendale, Washington, born in a local hospital last week, died Saturday morning.

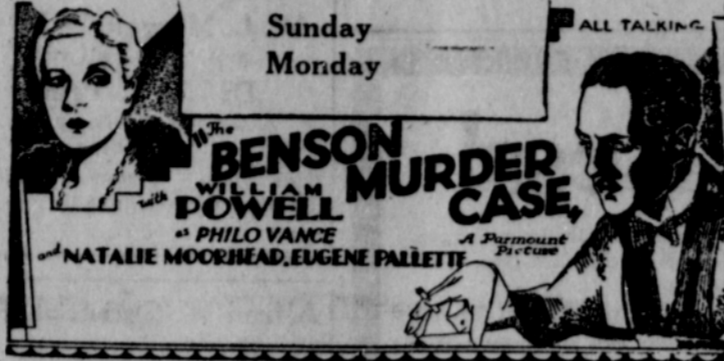
**Deputy Assessor Here.**
