Marshfield—City let contract to Pacific Livery and Transfer Co. to grade and gravel city's portion of Empire cut-off highway.

Portland—Bids to be opened Dec. 29, for laying \$200,000 pipe line project of water bureau across Ross Island bridge.

Roseburg—Contract let to R. I. Stuart & Son to construct sewer on Lyman Avenue in Wellington addition.

Marshfield—Going Hotel opened at Anderson and Broadway.

Oceanside—Bridge being built across Short Beach canyon between this place and Cape Mears Light-house.

Empire—Empire Cold Storage Co. installed plant for kipping salmon. Mill City—"Logue" purchased by Al Van Dahl of Salem.

Scio—Interior of Scio Pool Hall improved. Klamath Falls—Frank Lowell opened grocery store adjacent to Palace Market.

Roseburg—Southern Oregon Gas Co. laying four-inch gas main on several streets.
