The Home Economics club met at the Grange hall on the afternoon of May 19 with Mrs. Gordon Hoffnagle as hostess. Mrs. R. G. Penney presided during the business meeting. The topic for study was "The Value of Play for Children" as outlined by the extension service of O. S. C. The club voted to contribute \$5 to the Grange piano fund.

Mrs. Fix was given a vote of thanks for the efficient manner in which she disposed of the quilted spread.

Committees were appointed to arrange for a benefit social, the proceeds of which will help finance the 4-H club delegates at summer school. There is already \$15 in this fund as the premium received from the project fair last fall was turned over to help sponsor the 4-H club activities.

On reading the Oregon Emerald we note that Wallace Baker has been elected Senior man on the University executive council. The executive council is the integral working unit for all student activities. Wallace is the son of Mr. and Mrs. F. A. Baker.

PACIFIC SLOPE BANKS HOLD \$3,000,000,000.

According to a report in Tuesday's Oregonian there is a chance for prosperity if part of the money that is tied up in savings and time deposits were released. The report follows:

San Francisco, Cal., May 25.—"Savings in Pacific coast banks continued to pile up to new record levels for all time, the report of the San Francisco federal reserve bank released today showed.

After having set new records week after week, the trend showed no slackening last week, and May 20 some 50 key banks held \$1,084,000,000 in time deposits. This indicates about \$2,890,000,000 in all banks of the Pacific slope, according to Associated Press figures.

"The progress made in the last year amounted to some \$138,000,000, the same computations showed. In other words the stored-up buying power of the seven westernmost states has increased nearly \$15 a person in the last year, and now amounts to virtually \$300 on the average.

"These time deposits rose \$8,000,000 during the week in the key banks reporting weekly to the San Francisco federal reserve bank, used to give a cross section view of financial conditions in eight important financial centers—San Francisco, Los Angeles, Portland, Seattle, Salt Lake City, Spokane, Tacoma and Oakland.

"This accumulation of reserve purchasing power noted throughout the nation as well as on the coast, was pointed to yesterday by President James A. Farrell of the United States Steel corporation as one of the indications that "we possess within ourselves the power to speed business."

"While time deposits were rising, demand deposits also showed a gain of \$11,000,000 in the same fifty banks, putting drawing accounts up to \$751,000,000 against \$726,000,000 a year ago.

"The total loans and investments of the banks were \$1,992,000,000, a gain of \$4,000,000,000 during the week and up \$25,000,000 for the year. These gains were in borrowing for general commercial uses and bank investments in securities other than U. S. governments."
