FOREST RANGER TRAINING CAMP IN SESSION. The first forest ranger training camp for the national forests of Oregon and Washington will open at Hemlock Ranger Station in the Wind River Valley, southern Washington, on October 1, Regional Forester C. J. Buck has just announced.

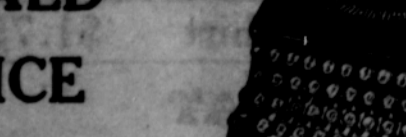
This training camp will be attended by 32 forest rangers from 19 different national forests of the two states, and will run from October 1 to 31. The men selected are the younger, newer men in the ranger force, who, the forest service believes are in greatest need and who will profit most from such a course. The purpose of the camp is to train rangers in the proper way to do their jobs, and the keynote of the camp will be "doing the job", rather than being told how to do it. How to estimate timber, scale logs, prepare government sale papers, how to lay out trails and build them, as well as telephone lines and lookout towers, how to prepare and organize for a large forest fire, and how to fight it, are some of the many things these young rangers will be taught by

having to do them on the ground. The men will be quartered in tents, will have a cook and lecture hall, though the primeval forest will be used mostly as a classroom.
