NEWSPAPERS TO ENTER BEST WEEKLY CONTEST.

UNIVERSITY OF OREGON, Eugene, December 12—The best weekly newspaper in Oregon, to be de-

termined by judges selected in the near future, will be awarded the Sigma Delta Chi cup at the Oregon Press conference at the University of Oregon, January 21, 22 and 23. This is the third successive year in which the organization, men's national journalistic honorary, has conducted the contest.


The Heppner Gazette-Times is the present holder of the cup, and according to the terms of the contest, cannot enter competition this year. The Hillsboro Argus won the cup the first year of the contest, and will be allowed to compete again in the forthcoming contest.

News and content, editorial page, front page, mechanical make-up, and advertising are the main points on which the papers will be judged, according to Robert Allen, Eugene, in charge of the contest, and Ralph David, Woodburn, president of the organization. Bi-weekly newspapers will be invited to enter the contest, as well as the weekly papers, those in charge state.
