WITH FARMERS AROUND THE STATE

ONTARIO—To test out the effectiveness of other materials recently developed for cover sprays in codling moth control, A. B. Cain, local fruit grower, has turned over several blocks of his orchard for some experiments being carried on this season under the supervision of County Agent Larson.

BAKER—Baker county farm products will be represented in the displays to be maintained in all the principal Portland hotels during the coming American Legion national convention. The county agent is working with a committee of the local chamber of commerce in assembling such display materials.

RICKREAL—A plan whereby all the farmers along a local drainage outlet known as Basket slough will cooperate in donating labor to improve it has been worked out by a

local committee headed by the county agent. This plan, it is thought, will avoid any organization costs and other expenses in case a drainage district were formed.

ASHLAND — Southern Oregon is still free from the cherry fruit fly, now such a pest in some other sections of the state, judging from tests made this past season by County Agent Wilcox.

HILLSBORO—Heavy applications of commercial fertilizer on land lacking in humus and otherwise in poor condition is a losing proposition, believes County Agent W. F. Cyrus after examining tests made by some growers of spinach and peas here who tried out the plan.

JUNCTION CITY—Glen Ström, a local farmer, has a seven-acre field of stemrot resistant sweet clover which he is growing for seed this year. The field is in excellent condition and promises to produce a high yield.

REDMOND—The largest number of dairy animals ever tested for disease at any one time have just been examined here in a campaign where- by contagious abortion testing was made available at 10 cents per head instead of the usual price of 35 cents.

PRAIRIE CITY—"Our alfalfa, where it was sutured, yielded three times what it did last year," is but one of the many similar enthusiastic comments of local farmers who have been using this treatment on their hay lands.

ROBERTS—"When mixing pastry for pies, I make enough to do for several bakings, states a Crook county homemaker. "I put it in a stone jar and store it in a cool place. Then when I am ready to bake pies I moisten the amount needed. This plan saves a lot of time when I have harvest hands to cook for. Incidentally, the wire pastry mixer is a big help too. As compared with the old way, it takes only half the time to cut in the shortening."

ELECTRIC TESTER DEVICE USED WITH PEARS

A farmer to succeed has long had to be a "jack of all trades" from economist to chemist, and now he will have to add a bit to his electrical ability if a new device for testing maturity of pears announced by the Oregon Experiment station comes into general use.

Not so many years ago the college research men took most of the guess work out of picking pears by devising a "mechanical thumb" by which the change in pressure needed to puncture the pear as it approached maturity could be measured.

Working as assistant horticulturist at the experiment station this past year, More has continued his experiments in cooperation with Medford pear growers are much interested in the project. Though handicapped by drought in his field work last year, More has carried his investigations to the point where a preliminary report has been published as an experiment station bulletin.

Moore has perfected an electrical device which gives accurate readings with pears, while it is compact enough to be easily portable for use throughout an orchard district.
