EUGENE—Interest in the use of chemicals for the control of noxious weeds is strong in Lane county, and County Agent O. S. Fletcher recently pooled orders for 500 pounds of atlacide for six farmers and 400 pounds of sodium chlorate for five farmers, at cost. A circular letter

telling of results with the chemicals in various parts of the county and giving information on their use was mailed to 188 other Lane county residents who have purchased chlorates through the county agent's office.
