COUNTIES TO HAVE OWN ASSOCIATIONS

Hog raisers in any county in Oregon will have opportunity to form their own hog production control associations and sign up for cash benefits under the national corn-hog adjustment program...

Regional associations were first contemplated for counties with small hog production but since it is learned that the corn-hog contracts are comparatively simple it is believed that even a county with only a half dozen growers can form its own association...

Census reports of 1930 credit Umatilla county with a total hog production of 6,627 head, and corn production of 628 acres, out of a state total of 224,539 hogs and 63,116 acres of corn.

Through this would give Oregon hog raisers a theoretical allotment of between 175,000 and 200,000 hogs and benefit payments at \$5 a head or just under a million dollars, actual benefits could not be nearly that high because of the minimum limits set for participation.

Definite rulings have been received by the Oregon extension service setting the minimum limit for joining the plan at 10 acres of corn or three litters of pigs a year, or both. Silage and soiling crop corn is included. Many believe that between 65 and 75 per cent of the hogs raised in Oregon are on farms where less than three litters a year are produced.

A farmer qualifying under either the corn or the hog provision can join for that one crop, though if he qualifies for both he must join for both. Reduction of at least 20 per cent in corn acreage and 25 per cent in hog production is required in return for rent payments on the corn land retired and cash benefits of \$5 a head on the allotment of 75 per cent of past average annual hog production.

THE OLEOMARGARINE SITUATION.

Sales of Oleomargarine in September were 38.5% heavier than the same month a year ago. The following figures show the comparison for the month of September and for the first nine months of the year. It is a situation to be reckoned with.

An increase over September 1932 of 6,247,828 pounds, equals 38.5%. During the first nine months in 1932 oleomargarine sales were 140,523,724 lbs.; the first nine months in 1933, 176,538,856 lbs.—Increase over first nine months in 1932—36,015,132 lbs. or equal to 25.6%.

This is a condition which has a direct effect upon the butter market and is one of the factors responsible for the present huge butter surplus. Figures just released by the American Association of Creamery Butter Manufacturers show that Ohio leads the field with sales in rural districts of 112 pounds of oleo to every 100 pounds of butter sold. Indiana shows 98 lbs. of oleo sold to every 100 lbs. of butter.

151,000,000 CO-OPERATIVE MEMBERS IN WORLD

Fourteen million members have been added to co-operative buying and selling organizations throughout the world during the three years of depression. This brings the world-wide membership of co-operatives up to the staggering figure of 151,000,000, considerably more than the total population of the United States.

The largest membership in is Russia, more than 95,000,000 people belonging to co-operative societies. In the rest of Europe there are approximately 39,000,000 members of co-operatives.

The biggest volume of business is done by farmers' co-operatives. Consumers' co-operative purchasing societies are second. The steady growth and increasing vitality of these co-operatives throughout the world is one of the most outstanding phenomena in modern history.

Carefully prepared committee reports were adopted by the convention dealing with taxation policies, farm finance and marketing, transportation, and production and handling.

Intelligent co-operation develops through a gradual evolution; to train the people to think co-operatively will be a process requiring time. As the people learn this lesson, co-operation will gain strength, command confidence, and extend greater benefits to its members.
