ENGLISH TOMATO DISEASE FOUND IN OREGON PLANTING.

Warning for Oregon tomato growers, especially those who grow early fruit in greenhouses, to be on the lookout for a new and extremely serious virus disease has just been issued by the Oregon State college experiment station. The dreaded English spotted wilt has just been identified on plants brought to the station from a greenhouse along the Oregon coast.

Dr. F. P. McWhorter, federal plant pathologist who made the identification, is hoping that the disease is confined to that one particular spot as this disease is sometimes seed borne and the grower
