Peach Spray Queries Answered.

CORVALLIS—In answer to numerous inquiries from Benton county farmers on control of peach leaf curl, County Agent W. S. Averill is

recommending that the trees be sprayed with Bordeaux 6-6-50 before the buds begin to swell or slip their scales. Because of the mild winter this swelling has already begun in some localities, he says, and

it would be well for growers in such districts to spray as soon as they have two or three days without rain.
