**COLEMAN AND MISS YOUNG HAVE LEADS IN PICTURE.**

"Clive of India," in which Ronald Coleman is said to give an unforgettable portrayal of the fatalist who within a short time rose from a clerkship in a tea office to be the conqueror of an eastern empire, will be at the Oasis Theatre Friday and Saturday.  
 The story of Clive, based on but not a stickler for historical fact, is taken from a stage play based on a novel of the man's career. The man was of quixotic temperament. He got the idea from an incident in his youth that he had a charmed life. His courage, bordering on recklessness, carried him to the heights of fame.  
 The picture is not entirely one of military conquest. It deals much with the romance in the man's career. Loretta Young appears as the wife who begged for more of his love and felt that the career Clive had elected to follow was supplanting her in his affection.  
 The story is said to be as different from other recent films about India as a romance is from an adventure. Twentieth Century, the studio producing it, has given the play a lavish setting and expended painstaking effort and much time to make the story true in the minutest detail.
