CORVALLIS—Uncle Sam has once more requisitioned the services of Miss Maud Wilson, home economist at Oregon State college and widely-known authority on all phases of modern housing.

Miss Wilson was called to Washington, D. C. early in December to accept a temporary appointment as housing consultant for the Federal

Resettlement administration, in which she will act as advisor on projects in different sections of the country. Her first assignment will take her on a trip into the south-eastern states to study living conditions in Texas, Tennessee, Arkansas and Louisiana.

Miss Wilson has been called to the national capitol on two previous occasions to assist in federal housing projects. She will return to O.S.C. in time for the opening of the college summer session.

Lee Bennett left Wednesday for his home in Colorado.

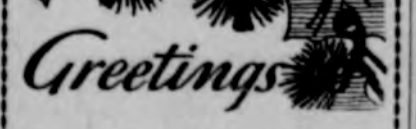
