GENERAL CROP SITUATIONS IMPROVED, REPORT SAYS.

Although not especially bright, general crop prospects over the country as a whole appeared to be better the first part of April than at that time in any of the past three years, according to the monthly review of the agricultural situation by the OSC extension service. In respect to price trends, the report indicates that the general level of farm prices in Oregon is still as high as a year ago despite some decline since February in Oregon and greater declines generally in the whole country.

The United States farm price index is now approximately 5 per cent below that of a month ago and about the same under the general farm price level of a year ago.

In explanation of these farm price trends, L. R. Brethaupt, extension agricultural economist, says that the Oregon farm price index has not been too high in relation to the income of industrial workers at any

time during the past year, while the United States farm price index has been relatively high in relation to the purchasing power of industrial workers. He thinks that these recent farm price trends are probably a natural adjustment of farm prices as the country gets back to more normal crop conditions.

Market prices during recent weeks indicate some recovery in the general level of farm prices compared with mid-March when the Oregon index stood at 70 per cent of the 1926-30 average, the circular points out. This was the lowest point since last October, although one point higher than in March last year.

Although egg prices in Oregon were but 55 per cent of the 1926-30 level, producers appear to be raising more chicks than last year. The government survey of commercial hatchery operations showed an increase of over 20 per cent in salable chicks hatched in March and over 27 per cent increase from January to March, inclusive. The increase in chicks booked for delivery in April or later was even greater.

Commenting on the dairy situation, the report says that the condition of pastures is not up to the ten-year average, but better than at this season for four years. Feed prices are relatively low, and more than the usual proportion of the cows are expected to freshen in the spring. Altogether, total milk production may be expected to continue well above last year's low level, at least for several months.

Stomach "Dredge" Is New Surgical Device

Philadelphia.—Surgeons may go "fishing" in human stomachs through a new device perfected by Dr. Gabriel Tucker, professor of bronchology of the University of Pennsylvania medical school.

So if you swallow your false teeth, an open safety pin or something equally dangerous, Doctor Tucker's new "tackle" is ready to be lowered into your stomach and start dredging operations.

Declared much simpler than equipment formerly used, the new invention contains a small pair of pliers at the end of the hollow rubber tube. Air is pumped in to inflate the organ and an x-ray device makes the area visible. Click! Doctor Tucker's pliers grab the swallowed article and snake it out via the tube.
