Activities of the Government in the Banking Field Are Reviewed and Position of Banks Analyzed

NEW YORK.—Detailed bank researches, covering all phases of practical operating and economic facts and conditions related to banking, are being made by the American Bankers Association.

Among the most extensive researches being conducted by the American Bankers Association is that of its Committee on Banking Studies, which is making a detailed survey of Federal Government lending agencies and policies.

The Government in Banking "It is not the intention of the committee to express its viewpoint about any agency," says the foreword to this material.
