

AMENDMENT LIMITING AND REDUCING PERMISSIBLE TAXES ON TANGIBLE PROPERTY—Purpose: Constitution—1 amendment to limit and reduce the total permissible state tax on real and tangible personal property payable in 1937, to 6 mills per dollar of assessed and equalized valuation thereof, reducing such limit 4 per cent annually to 4.8 mills in 1942 and thereafter; limiting county, city, town, district, port and political subdivision levies to same total millage payable for 1935, for 1945, and thereafter. People may vote increase any one year, and reducing such limit 4 per cent thereof annually to 80 per cent of the value of property shall be assessed one-half true cash value at time assessed.
