

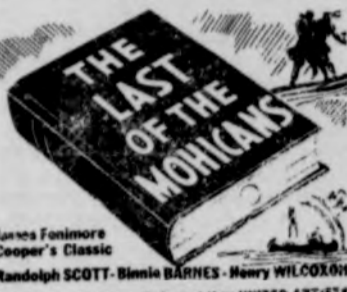

HOT WATER BROODER HOUSE HEATING SYSTEM FAVORED

(Continued from Page One) more prevalent. On most soil on the project this precaution is not so necessary because of the drier, sandier soil.

An auxiliary heating unit added to the underground unit might be a solution in regulating the heat.

Harry Kelley and Neil Boynton have a flock of 3000 turkeys, 2700 of which are now ready for the holiday markets.

They started the first year with 500 eggs which were purchased from the Merrill Potter flock and hatched in their own incubators. The third year they increased to 1300, and the following year to 2700. The fourth year they brought the breeding stock from the Willamette valley to hatch poult for their present flock of 3000.

These birds were brooded in one

large house and six small unit houses which are heated by coal oil burner stoves. The large house has an underground heating system. Boynton and Kelley believe the longer and larger unit is operated with less expense and labor than the smaller individual units.

They expect to keep 300 birds for breeding stock this fall and to increase their flock if the market price this fall warrants the necessary extensions.
