lover."  
"I would like to see a greater variety of Iris grown here." Mrs. Dean said, "to insure bloom from March until August, starting with the dwarf Iris in the spring. The colorings are delicate and beautiful and have been developed from the common Iris to a gorgeous plant. It is necessary, however, that the bulbs be separated at regular intervals to prevent congestion and deterioration in the plant. The Japanese Iris does not do well here."  
"Another plant that blooms late in the fall and which has been developed in shades of red-pink, lilac, white and purple, is the Michaelmas Daisy. One root will soon provide the entire neighborhood with plants, and because of such profuse increase it is best to place the plant in a plot large enough to take care of this extra growth, or keep the roots dug and separated each season.
