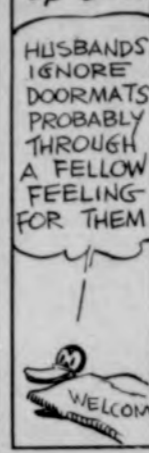

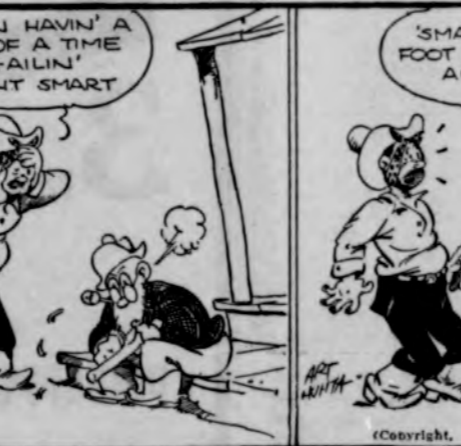

Lantern to Hunt Snails

An odd exhibit in the collection of heating and lighting utensils in the United States Museum at Washington is an attractive little lantern found in Spain many years ago and said to have been used as a light in hunting for snails.

Italians Used Many Woods

Walnut, chestnut, oak, pine, cypress, elm, beech and poplar were the woods from which Italian furniture of the Fifteenth and Sixteenth centuries were made. Practically all the finer pieces were walnut.

"Vegetable Gardens" Put in Box

When Men Powdered Hair

Captain Kidd's Pewter Listed

Among the pewter items listed in 1701 in the estate of Capt. William Kidd, the pirate, were three tankards, thirteen dishes, two candlesticks, thirty plates, five basins and two salt-cellars.

In France men wore leather gloves long before women. In Louis XIV's time ladies first set off the beauty of their hands and arms with kid gloves or long knitted-silk mittens.
