**SECURITY THEME OF FAMILY CONFERENCE**

"The Importance of Security in Our Life", will be the theme for discussion by Mrs. Maude Morse, Ex-

tension Specialist in Parent Education, from Oregon State college at Umatilla County's Family Living Conference, October 6th. The conference will be held in the Little Theatre of the Vert Memorial at Pendleton starting at 10:00 o'clock. "It is our second annual conference of this kind", says Miss Frances Clinton, Home Demonstration Agent "and we welcome fathers as well as mothers."

Exhibits of books, bulletins, inexpensive pamphlets and furniture for the child's room will be on display. A day nursery will be open where children may be left while mothers attend the meeting. Each one should bring sandwiches, cookies and fruit for salad as part of the luncheon.

Mrs. Morse will discuss the question of security both economic and emotional, physical and spiritual. She will further develop such phases as: How may religion contribute to our feeling of security; how do our schools help children to feel secure or insecure; what can be done in a broken and unhappy home to contribute to the security of the children; in the face of financial security how can the children be made to feel secure, etc?

**DRESS GOODS LABELS NEED SCANNING**

More informative labels on all kinds of merchandise are being demanded by homemakers all over the country as the result of a greatly increased interest in intelligent buy-shipment, says Miss Eileen Perdue, acting extension specialist in clothing and textiles at Oregon State college. Manufacturers of many articles have recognized and responded in some measure to this demand, she says.

When it comes to buying clothing and yard goods, however, the consumer is still pretty much at the mercy of the manufacturer, especially if she does not fully understand the meaning of the trade terms used, Miss Perdue points out. For instance, the terms "shrunk" and "pre-shrunk", which are used a great deal in the dry goods business, are vague and misleading, because they have no definite meaning, and the goods may or may not shrink when washed in the usual way.

Materials or garments bearing the labels "completely shrunk," "will not shrink," or "fully shrunk," however, can be expected to do very little shrinking. Cottons bearing the label "sanforized," can be depended upon to shrink not more than one-fourth inch per yard, which is a negligible amount, Miss Perdue says.

The matter of color fastness has been a problem in both ready-to-wear and in yardage, she says. "Fast color" labels mean little, and nothing can be done if the color does fade. She suggests that a really helpful label would be one stating that the material is "fast color from water, weather, boiling or perspiration." Some fabrics now bear the Nafel label issued by the National Association of Finishers of Textile Fabrics, which indicates that the material has been tested and found to conform to the association's standards for fast color to light and washing.

In buying silk the term "pure-dye" does not refer to the purity of the dye used nor to the purity of the silk, but rather to the amount of weighting in the material. A silk may bear this label if it contains not more than 10 per cent metallic weighting for all colors except black, which may contain as much as 15 per cent. The term "pure silk" does not mean the same as "pure-dye" silk, although some manufacturers use it with this meaning. Generally, however, the term "pure silk" has no definite meaning, Miss Perdue says.
