Under the above heading appear

ed an editorial in the Oregon State college paper written by Bob Henderson, president of the associated students. Bob is a graduate of the Hermiston high school and the son of Mrs. Georgia Henderson of Hermiston. In the editorial Bob is pointing out the need of campus activities for a well rounded college education, stressing especially membership in ASOSC which permits such activity.

Bob's early training, home associations, disposition and feeling toward all people in the way of equal rights regardless of social position, have been major factors determining his election to the office he now holds as head of the associated students of O. S. C. His achievements may be held as examples for other Hermiston young men and women who have equally as many opportunities to accomplish things.
