### WHEAT CONTROL PROGRAM WATCHED

Oregon wheat growers, through the eastern Oregon Wheat league, are taking an active interest in the new farm legislation now before Congress, and have expressed their desires, so far as the wheat program is concerned, through definite resolutions which have been forwarded to the congressional delegation.

The committee on federal programs drew major interest at this year's convention and was in session at various times throughout the three days before and during the convention.

After hearing the outline of an administration wheat program from C. E. Carter, representing the western division of the AAA, and giving opportunity to all to express their opinions, the committee adopted an 11-point program, which was confirmed by the convention without material change, although several features were warmly debated.

The program advanced by the Wheat league is based on a continuation of present agricultural conservation programs, supplemented by a voluntary acreage control plan, together with possible marketing quotas to be used upon a vote of the wheat growers themselves. Following is an outline of the 11-point program urged by the convention:

1. Continuing of Soil Conserva-

tion program; 2. Production control to be exercised by voluntary means but with the provision that when burdensome surpluses develop that marketing quotas for every wheat grower may be established by a two-thirds majority vote of the producers; 3. Provision for benefit payments sufficient to bring price and income to parity; 4. Crop insurance; 5. Designation of wheat produced in white wheat area as a separate commodity with special treatment in subsidization of exports; 6. Commodity loans of at least 50 per cent of parity when total supplies of white wheat exceed 93 million bushels.

7. Processing tax on wheat to finance benefit payments in excess of payments provided under conservation program; 8. No discrimination in payments because of size of operation; 9. Adequate consumer safeguards; 10. Provision for intervention by secretary of agriculture in proposed freight rate increases on agricultural products; 11. Adequate tariff protection for wheat.

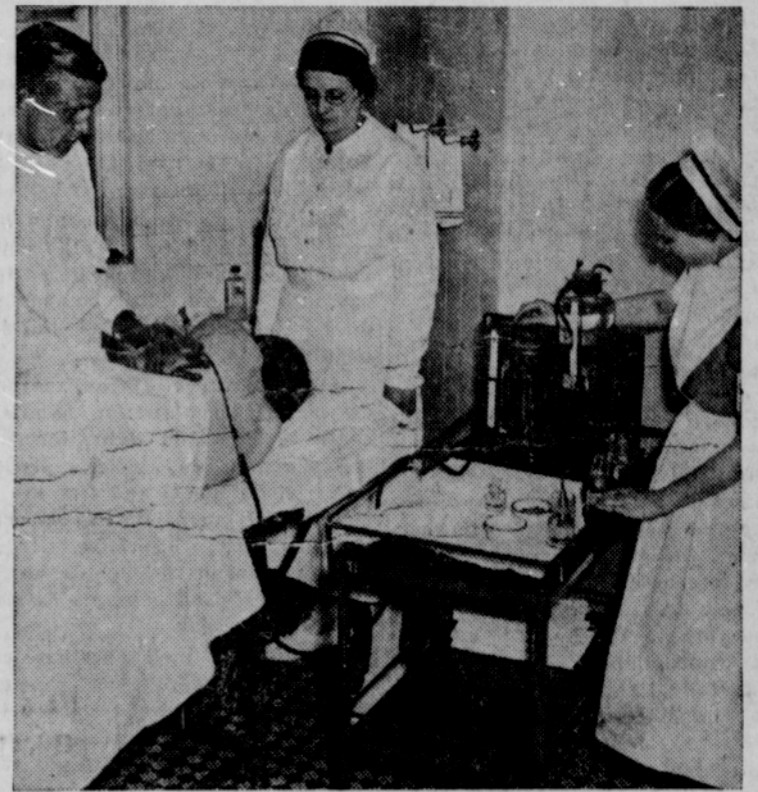

### Resting the Lung by Injecting Air



This patient is receiving pneumothorax treatment for tuberculosis, a painless method used widely in this country since 1912. Pneumo means air and thorax refers to the chest, and the procedure is to inject a gas into the space between the chest wall and outer surface of the lung. By this process the infected lung is put to rest, thereby restricting respiration to the healthy lung. When tuberculosis is discovered in its early stages pneumothorax treatment

can save thousands of lives. Many men and women today are back at work, healthy and useful, because they can go to their doctors periodically and receive "refills" of air. Pneumothorax is one of the modern weapons advocated by the National Tuberculosis Association and its 2,000 affiliated state and local associations. Their educational campaign is financed by Christmas Seals sold between Thanksgiving and Christmas.
