ANNUAL DAIRY REPORT SHOWS BENEFITS IN MAINTAINING HIGH PRODUCING COWS

The Umatilla-Morrow Dairy Herd Improvement association has just completed the year's work, according to H. R. Hartley, tester of the Umatilla-Morrow D.H.I.A. In comparing the 10 low and 10 high cows in the association it was found that the 10 high produce three times as much butterfat as the 10 low, and returned thirty-four times as much profit above feed cost. It cost \$13.84 more per cow to feed the average of the 10 high than the average of the 10 low, yet the profit above feed cost was \$133.10 for the average of the 10 high compared to \$38.23 for the average of the 10 low. There were 27 herds enrolled in the association at the end of the year. Figuring on the cow year basis, there was an average of 307 cows completing the 12 months' test. The average pounds of milk produced per cow was 6441.7, yielding 287.2 pounds of butterfat. The average gross return per cow was \$136.95. The average cost of roughage per cow was \$32.12, and the average cost of grain was \$13.54, making a total of \$45.66, the average feed cost per cow per year. The average returns per cow above feed cost was \$91.29, however, this does not take in labor, depreciation, and interest on investment. The average cow in the association returned \$2.99 for each \$1.00 spent for feed. It costs \$0.71 to produce each 100 pounds of milk and \$0.16 to produce each pound of butterfat. This takes into account only feed costs—labor and other expenditures not included. There were 34 cows sold to the stock yards during the year as unprofitable. It is believed that feeding grain to the higher producing group was a determining factor in getting higher returns, since the average cow in the 10 high group received \$21.41 worth of grain as compared to \$6.09 for the low group. The highest cow in the association was owned by L. C. Dyer of Hermiston, a four-year-old registered Jersey, Crown Oxford Girl, produced 7347 pounds of milk, 454.2 pounds of butterfat.
