"DOCTRINE of Atonement" was the subject of the Lesson-Sermon in all Churches of Christ, Scientist, on Sunday, April 17.

The Golden Text was, "I and my Father are one" (John 10:30). Among the citations which comprised the Lesson-Sermon was the following from the Bible: "And be not conformed to this world: but be ye transformed by the renewing of your mind, that ye may prove what is that good, and acceptable, and perfect, will of God" (Rom. 12:2).

The Lesson-Sermon also included the following correlative passages from the Christian Science textbook, "Science and Health with Key to the Scriptures" by Mary Baker Eddy: "Dost thou 'love the Lord thy God with all thy heart, and with all thy soul, and with all thy mind'? This command includes much, even the surrender of all merely material sensation, affection, and worship. This is the El Dorado of Christianity. It involves the Science of Life, and recognizes only the divine control of Spirit, in which Soul is our master, and material sense and human will have no place" (p. 9).

Catholic Priest Pens Navajo Native Language

Gallup, N. M.—It has taken 37 years and the job isn't complete, but Rev. Fr. Berard Haile, of St. Michaels, Ariz., is giving the Navajo Indian a written language.
The Catholic priest, a leading authority on the Navajo tongue, has just completed the second Navajo-English catechism to be published. He hopes it may enable a few more Navajos to learn to read and write their native language.
Father Berard was assigned to Indian territory in 1900. The St. Michaels mission had been established only two years and priests and nuns were attempting to familiarize themselves with Navajo phonetics.

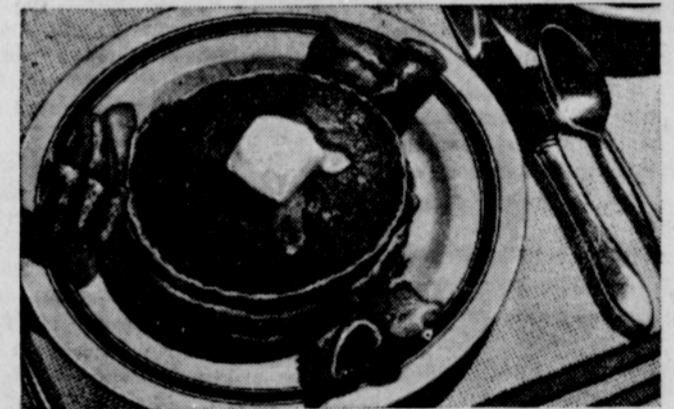

Herald Cooking School - May 9 - 10

Sunday Morning is Pancake Morning

These modern pancakes do away with all the fuss and bothersome ingredients, but they still have that good old fashioned tastiness.

HAM PANCAKES

And to satisfy that "meat for breakfast" hunger there's nothing better than Ham

Pancakes made from the following ingredients:

1 cup Aunt Jemima Pancake Ready-Mix
1 1/4 cups water, or milk
1/2 cup baked ham, minced
Mix and bake according to package directions. This recipe makes eight cakes.

CREPE PANCAKES

Crepe Pancakes are surprisingly good and always call for an encore. If you like them French style and tissue thin, tip the pan as you add the batter so as to produce the thinnest possible coating over the bottom of the pan. Then bake to a golden brown. The following ingredients will make ten or twelve cakes:

1 cup Aunt Jemima Pancake Ready-Mix
1 1/2 cups milk

Mix and bake according to general directions and serve rolled, either plain or with a powdered sugar and jelly filling.

Did You Know That—

- 1—Tuberculosis was known 3,000 years B. C. to the ancient Greeks as Pthilisis, a wasting disease?
- 2—Dr. Rene Laennec, a young French physician, discovered the stethoscope in 1819?
- 3—Robert Koch's discovery of the tuberculosis germ in 1882 stands as one of the greatest scientific achievements of all time?
- 4—The National Tuberculosis Association was organized in 1904, when there were only a half-dozen organized tuberculosis associations? Now there are 2,000 state, county and city associations throughout the United States supported chiefly by the income from Christmas Seals?
- 5—An important accessory in modern tuberculosis diagnosis is the X-ray? It was discovered by Wilhelm Konrad Roentgen in 1895.
- 6—The tuberculin test as a means of detecting tuberculous infection was devised by Clemens von Pirquet in 1907, and the Mantoux or intradermal test was devised in the same year?
- 7—The first free tuberculosis hospital was founded in Boston in 1857; the first clinic for the tuberculous poor in New York City in 1894; the first state tuberculosis sanatorium at Rutland, Massachusetts, in 1898?
- 8—The first Christmas Seal Sale in the United States was held in Wilmington, Delaware, in 1907?
- 9—The first educational pamphlet for non-medical readers was written and published in 1889 by Dr. Hermann M. Biggs, Commissioner of Health, New York City?
- 10—Dr. Edward L. Trudeau inaugurated modern sanatorium treatment of tuberculosis in the United States at Saranac Lake in 1885?
- 11—The first voluntary association to fight tuberculosis was organized in Pennsylvania in 1892 by Dr. Lawrence F. Flick?
- 12—In 1859, Dr. Hermann Bremer, a German physician, opened a sanatorium for tuberculous people in the Black Forest in southern Germany? This is credited as being the first successful tuberculosis sanatorium in the world.
- 13—In 1900, out of every 100,000 people living 200 died of tuberculosis in the United States every year? This year about 50 will die in the same number of people.
