

NATIONAL AIR MAIL WEEK MAY 15 TO 21

National Air Mail week has been designated from May 15 to May 21 in an effort to induce the use of air mail facilities. The event is in the nature of an educational campaign to instruct citizens how and why they should use the faster service provided by the United Postal department.

A glance at a map of air mail routes throughout the country shows that many main lines cross the continent and branch lines lead into every large community which makes it possible to reach air mail service quickly by stage or train. Letters mailed at Hermiston will bear an air mail stamp containing the words, "Hermiston, Umatilla County, Oregon—Famous for its livestock and poultry—Columbia River, Umatilla Rapids dam development, on the Portland-Pendleton Air line."

PEDESTRIANS ARE WARNED BY SNELL

If last May's traffic experiences are repeated this month, pedestrians will find it worth while to keep an especially sharp look-out, Secretary of State Earl Snell warned today.

Of 36 persons killed in Oregon traffic accidents in May, 1937, more than half, or a total of 19, were on foot at the time of the accident, Snell said.

"While it is hard to account for the exceptionally large number of pedestrians who met death last May, we find that many of them were guilty of careless acts which contribute almost daily to the traffic toll," Snell commented. "Thus, three of them were struck while crossing intersections diagonally; three while walking on the highway in the same direction as automobile traffic; two while crossing streets between intersections, and another while coming from behind a parked vehicle.

"Carelessness such as this seldom results in the saving of time, and may have the most serious consequences. Anyone who stopped to weigh the advantages of a careless act against the disadvantages would realize how foolish it is to walk in traffic without respect for established rules, and without paying strict attention to the movement of vehicles."

About half of the pedestrians killed last May were either children under 14 years of age, or persons over 65 years of age, Snell said, indicating that every occasion should be taken to warn people in these groups against the perils of traffic, and give them the proper consideration and protection.

ASPARAGUS—VELVEETA SAUCE

1/2 lb. Kraft Velveeta
1/2 cup milk
Hot cooked asparagus
Slowly heat the Velveeta and milk in the top of a double boiler, stirring occasionally until Velveeta is melted. Serve a generous amount of this hot sauce over each portion of asparagus.

BANANA FRITTERS

Melted Spry
4 medium bananas
1/2 cup Pillsbury's Best Flour
Fritter batter

For shallow frying, have 1 inch of melted Spry in frying pan. For deep-fat frying, have deep kettle 1/2 to 3/4 full of melted Spry. Heat Spry to 375° F. (or until a 1-inch cube of bread will brown in 40 seconds). Cut bananas crosswise into quarters, halves or 1-inch thick pieces. Roll pieces in flour, then dip into fritter batter, completely coating the banana with the batter. Shallow fry or deep-fat fry in the hot Spry 4 to 6 minutes or until brown and tender. Drain on unglazed paper. Serve very hot. Six to eight servings.

BANANA FRITTERS

Fritter Batter
1 cup sifted Pillsbury's Best Flour
1/2 cup sugar
1 1/2 teaspoons salt
2 teaspoons baking powder
1 egg, well beaten
1/2 cup milk
2 teaspoons melted Spry
Sift together the flour, sugar, salt and baking powder. Combine egg and milk, and add gradually to dry ingredients, stirring until batter is smooth. Then stir in Spry. This is a stiff batter.

POTATO SALAD

4 cups sliced cooked potatoes
2 cups diced celery
1/2 cup capers
Salt pepper
Miracle Whip Salad Dressing
Lettuce
Boiled or baked ham
Stuffed olives

Toss together the potatoes, celery, capers, seasonings to taste, and salad dressing to moisten well. On a round chop plate place a border of crisp lettuce. Add a row of sliced ham, then fill the center of the plate with potato salad so that the ham slices outline the mound of salad. Cut additional sliced ham into Julienne strips and sprinkle them over the top of the salad. Garnish the plate with stuffed olives.

Advice on Shopping

When you go "to market, to market" to choose your groceries, be sure you know how to buy your bananas. Here's the latest advice from marketing experts:

Buy bananas just as you find them in the store. Many prefer to buy bananas by the "hand" or cluster. Keep your bananas in the fruit bowl or basket (they make a charming decoration) and allow them to ripen at comfortable room temperature, do not put in a refrigerator. Cut off each "finger" or separate banana as needed, using a sharp knife, so as not to tear open the germ-proof peel.

When the banana is yellow with a slightly green tip, it is partially ripe. Use it for cooking, at this stage of ripeness. Bake, broil or fry the partially ripe banana, to serve as a vegetable.

When the green has entirely disappeared from the tip, the all-yellow banana is excellent for cooking as a vegetable and for use in pies, cakes, puddings and breads.

When the yellow peel is flecked with brown, the banana is fully ripe and at its best for immediate eating as a sweet fruit.

Prize Banana Frosting

1/2 cup mashed banana (1 large 1 lb. (2 1/2 cups) banana)
1/2 cup butter
1/2 cup confectioner's sugar
1/2 teaspoon lemon juice

Mix together the banana and lemon juice. Cream butter with one cup of the sugar, then add banana and remaining sugar alternately. Fill and frost one 8-inch layer cake

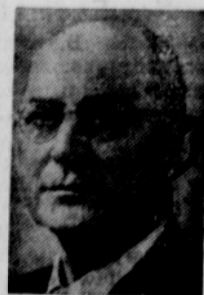
