**Yield Tests Run on Alfalfas.**

MADRAS—Ladak alfalfa far out-yielded both Grimm and common on variety test plots on the John Bolter farm at Willowdale, figures kept by County Agent K. W. Sawyer show. The plots were seeded on the same day, with the same amount of seed. The Ladak yielded 158 pounds of green weight per square rod, the Grimm 97 and the common 84. These figures are for the first cutting. A similar test will be started on another plot, and records kept on both for the next several years, Sawyer says.
