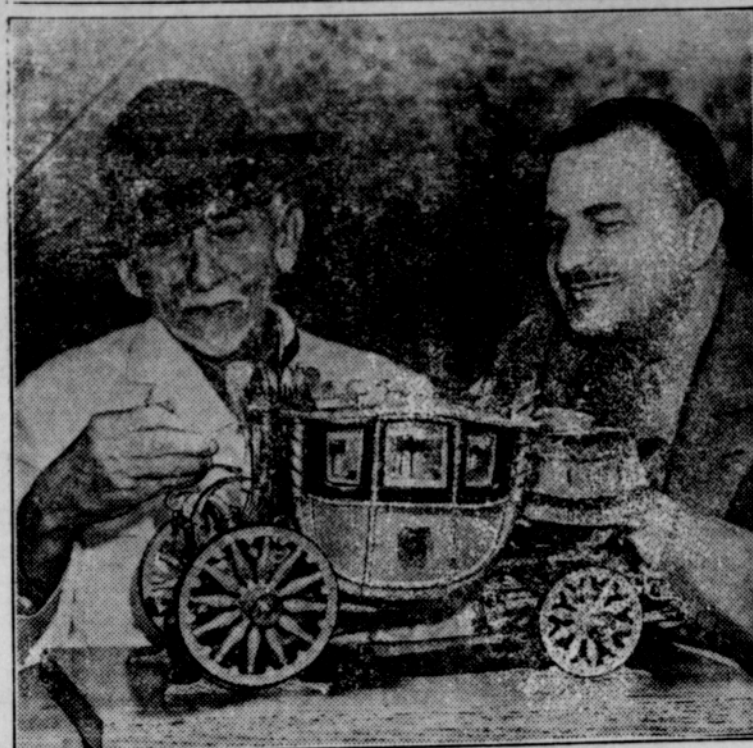
FAMILY PLAY IMPORTANT IN CHILD DEVELOPMENT

How can we find more time for the family to play together? This is the question uppermost in the minds of a great many people today who are beginning to realize that making a good life is more important than making a good living, and that people are spending too much time making a living and neglecting to live, says Mrs. Maud Morse, extension specialist in child development and parent education at Oregon State college.

The education and recreation of family members used to be two of the chief functions of the home. Today these are taken over by public schools, libraries, playgrounds, parks, theaters, public golf courses, tennis courts, community recreational centers and other agencies. While these are highly desirable, a great opportunity for family living is lost if these are allowed to displace entirely the home as a recreation center, Mrs. Morse believes.

Children get their first experience in living in their own homes, Mrs. Morse explains. They get their attitudes, their beliefs, their practices and many of their opinions from their parents. Through the family playing together, parents can teach fair play, give and take, the value of cooperation, and the fun of sharing. Happy is the home which is not only the child's first playground, but which continues to be the favorite gathering place for the members of the family, says Mrs. Morse. There are many things families can do together, such as playing games, celebrating birthdays, pur-

suing hobbies, reading books, and similar activities, but it is the quality of association much more than the quantity that produces the greatest returns in happiness, Mrs. Morse feels. An hour of fishing with Dad will create more satisfaction in the adolescent than a whole day of aimless being together, she says.

Families are budgeting for nearly everything else nowadays—why not budget time for playing together, Mrs. Morse asks.

LIBRARY PROJECT BENEFITS 3,000

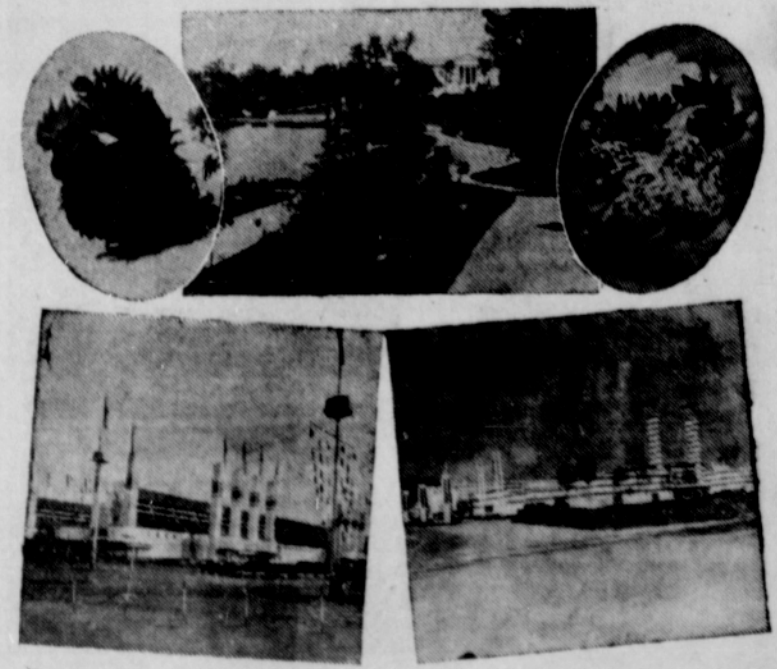
During the coming six months the Umatilla County Library will be able to further extend its services to the reading public in Pendleton through the assistance of the National Youth Administration. Ivan G. Munro, Oregon head of the NYA, announced today from his Portland office that a work project to employ two girls between the ages of 18 and 25 years had been granted the public library.

Miss Elizabeth J. Olson, present county librarian, presented the request to the Youth Administration and will be directly in charge of the work done by the young employees. The project will be jointly sponsored by the NYA and the county library, Mr. Munro added.

Miss Olson, a graduate of the University of Washington Library School, estimated that the work project would directly benefit well over three thousand persons who now make use of the library facilities.

The NYA employees will help extend the public and school library services, learn book binding and repairing, and generally assist Miss Olson with her work. The National Youth Administration policy is to place its young employees in positions whenever possible where they can acquire knowledge and skills which will benefit them in the future and help them get employment with private enterprise. Recent figures show that of an average NYA work projects, over 213 have found private employment within the last six months, indicating the value of the experience received through the Youth Administration, the NYA head pointed out.

World's Poultry Congress Scenes



In the above pictures are shown some of the scenes where the World's Poultry Congress will be held in Cleveland, July 28 to August 7, 1939. The central picture above shows the Cleveland Museum of Art and grounds surrounding it where some of the activities of the World's Poultry Congress will center. Below are two of the buildings which will house the exhibits. On the right is shown the Hall of Live Poultry and on the left is shown part of the Hall of Nations and States. The two lower buildings cover about four acres and will give room for a great many exhibits. The bird shown on the right above is a mottled Chabo of Japan, while on the left is a Japanese Frizzled Bantam. Over 200 varieties of fowl will be shown at the Congress and almost as many varieties of pigeons. Already several nations have definitely applied for exhibit space and more than thirty have announced their intention of planning an exhibit.

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
