**Notice of Budget Meeting for Umatilla County**

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN to the Taxpayers of Umatilla County, State of Oregon, that a meeting will be held in the County Court room of the County Court House in the City of Pendleton, Umatilla County, Oregon, on Monday the 21st day of November, A.D. 1938, at the hour of 10:00 o'clock A. M. of said day, for the purpose of discussing the budget for said Umatilla County, Oregon, for the year 1938, with the levying board of said County.
