The party sponsored by the committee Friday night was attended by 100 people, and funds garnered will be used in the cemetery improvement work. The club plans to sponsor a community sing once a week in the community hall.

TOWNSEND SPEAKER HERE FRIDAY

BULLDOGS WIN TWO HOME GAMES; LOSE TO HELIX

The loss of three games the previous week end did not discourage the Hermiston Bulldogs because they came back fighting and won two home games, but lost a third game to the Helix Grizzlies at Helix.

Friday night the Hermiston A and B squads took a double header from the two Boardman squads. Pierson and Corpe started the game at the forward position, with Gettman at guard, a combination that put the scoring about equal on each man. Corpe and Crampton each garnered five points while the others each had three. The Hermiston B squad took the Boardman B squad to a 13 to 5 cleaning.

With Kononen leading the way for the Helix Grizzlies, the Bulldogs were downed 27 to 11 at Helix Monday night. The Helix lads piled up a steady gain, getting 7 points in each of the first three quarters, and 6 points in the final. Kononen was high with 10 points to his credit. Corpe and Rankin each scored 4 points for the Bulldogs. The Hermiston girls took a beating from the Helix girls, 28 to 20, in the preliminary.

The Bulldogs played one of their best games of the season Wednesday night by trimming the Wa-Hi "B" squad 25 to 23. Rankin led the locals with a fast game that gave him high point honors of both teams. He sank the ball for 11 points. Tiller also played a bang-up game at guard and had 7 points at the final whistle. He was tied with Pankow, a substitute, who showed that he could sink the ball. Last but not least diminutive Ripley, who was substituted in the final minute, first tried one long shot that was short, but just before the whistle blew he tried another long one from the side which dropped in to stay.

The Bulldogs kept the lead from the beginning, leading 8 to 4 in the first quarter, 12 to 8 at half, and 19 to 28 in the third.

The Hermiston town team lost to the Jack Allen quintet last night in their fourth game of the Umatilla County Basketball League, which includes teams from Adams, Pendleton, Athena and Milton. The final score was 18 to 23. The next home game will be with the Athena five January 23.
