CHRISTIAN SCIENCE CHURCHES
 "UNREALITY" was the subject of the Lesson-Sermon in all Churches of Christ, Scientist, on Sunday, April 2.

The Golden Text was, "Remove far from me vanity and lies: give me neither poverty nor riches; feed me with food convenient for me." (Prov. 30:8).

Among the citations which comprised the Lesson-Sermon was the following from the Bible: "Woe unto them that seek deep to hide their counsel from the Lord, and their works are in the dark, and they say, Who seeth us? and who knoweth us?" (Isa. 29:15).

The Lesson-Sermon also included the following correlative passages from the Christian Science textbook, "Science and Health with Key to the Scriptures" by Mary Baker Eddy: "Error is a supposition that pleasure and pain, that intelligence, substance, life, are existent in matter. Error is neither Mind nor one of Mind's faculties. Error is the contradiction of Truth. Error is a belief without understanding. Error is unreal because untrue" (p. 472).

PRODUCERS PLAN LARGE TURKEY CROP

From the U. S. Dept. of Agriculture. Turkey producers in the United States are planning large increases in the number of turkeys to be raised this year, according to early February intention reports. More than 4,000 producers who bought or hatched 2,750,000 poults in 1938 now show that big increases are intended in all major regions of the country. If the indicated increases should be realized, turkey producers in the United States would hatch or buy about 27 percent more turkey poults in 1939 than in 1938. The actual percent of increase in turkeys raised, however, will probably be less than that figure. Last year producers reported an expected increase of poults of about 6 percent, whereas the increase in turkeys raised seems to have been only about 2 percent. A record gain of 35 percent was made in 1936.

The reported number of turkey poults that producers intend to obtain from commercial hatcheries shows a 34 percent increase over purchases last year. Intended purchases of poults show large increases in all areas, being up 27 percent in the North Atlantic and Far Western regions and 33 to 38 percent in the other major regions. An increase of 22 percent in home hatched poults is expected. The returns for these show wider variations between regions than do those for purchased poults, but they also show gains for all major regions.

GARDENS ARE AID TO GOOD HEALTH

Well planned gardens help insure good health for farm families cooperating in the Farm Security Administration live-at-home program in Umatilla county, reports Emily R. Husbands, home management supervisor, Federal building, Pendleton. Each family attempts to produce as much of the home vegetable supply on the farm as possible.

Gardens are planned to supply all fresh vegetables needed during summer months and provide enough additional produce to enable the homemaker to can not less than 26 to 30 quarts of tomatoes or juice and 30 to 40 quarts of vegetables for each member of the family, in addition to producing from 225 to 270 pounds of potatoes per person. Stored root crops and dried vegetables make a wide variety available for the planning of attractive meals during winter months when fresh vegetables are dear.

After giving careful consideration to preferences of the family and the maximum vegetable requirements to provide an adequate year-round diet, the family garden is laid out to meet these specifications. Several plant-

ings of different vegetables are made on the same ground by following early and quick growing crops with other plantings as soon as the first crop has been harvested. Provisions for some irrigation often doubles the output.

Farm Security cooperators desiring assistance in planning their gardens may secure extension service and department of agriculture bulletins as well as other aid through the County Farm Security Administration office, Federal Building, Pendleton.

NOTED SCENES ADD CHARM TO FILM

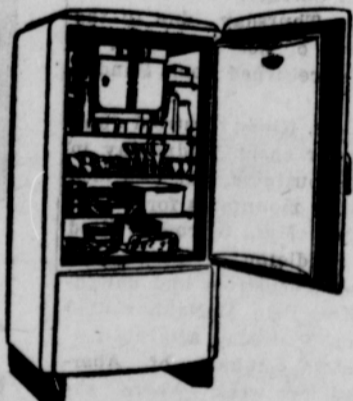
