Mr. and Mrs. Ralph Bartley were Portland visitors last week.

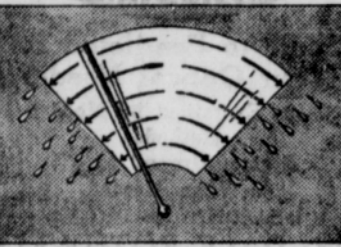
Miss Dorothy Thomson of Portland who is teaching the 7th grade, is making her home with Mrs. Ila Wallace.

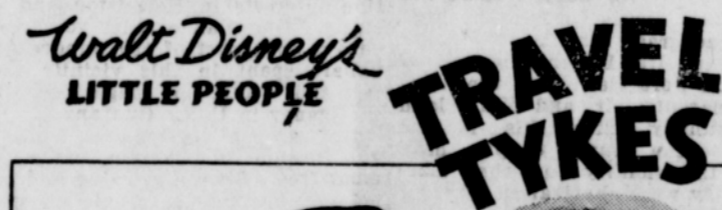
