NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN to the Taxpayers of Umatilla County, State of Oregon, that a meeting will be held in the County Court room of the County Court House in the City of Pendleton, Umatilla County, Oregon, on Wednesday the 8th day of November, A.D. 1939, at the hour of 10:00 o'clock A.
