Miss Mable and Elsie Rauch are spending a few days at home during teachers' institute.

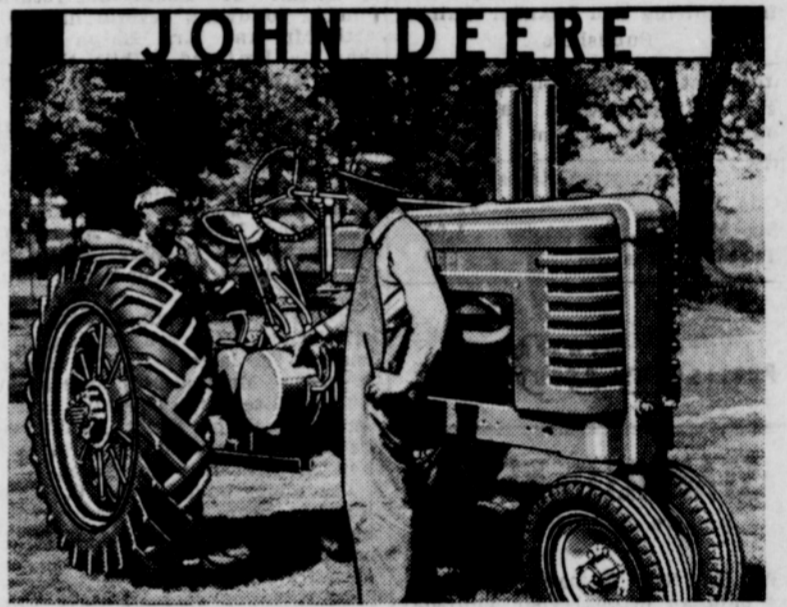
The McGreer and Harrison homes are being remodeled this fall.
