Wild salsify, milkweed, weed grasses, rose hips, cattails or teal are good materials to select and the more you handle them the more conscious you become of the beauty in the lines and delicate traceries. If some of the grasses are put in a clear glass container in a window where the light can filter through and show the stems, or if the arrangement can be placed in front of a mirror, then the beauty will be doubled.
