GARDEN CLUB CHATS

There are comparatively few house plants which will do well in north windows, though there are some which seem to thrive best without sunlight. These are mostly foliage plants, having few if any blooms. In this classification are ferns, English ivy and Rex begonias. Ferns require considerable light, and a moist soil, but are sensitive to drafts. English ivy will do best in moist soil and will stand extremes in temperature. English ivy may

also be successfully grown in water in hanging vases to attractively frame both sides of a window. Wandering Jew in both green and variegated colors may be used in the same way. If a small piece of charcoal is put in the water it will prevent stem rot and keep the water sweet.

Rex begonias do well without sunlight, though some sun will deepen the colors in the foliage. They require moist soil and may need to be pinched back to keep them compact in form.
