**Planed Lumber at \$2 to \$5 M Less**

It is my opinion that planed lumber can be sold here in Hermiston at from \$2.00 to \$5.00 per thousand less if the lumber is bought in the rough from the small mills that do not have planers, brought here to be dried and planed. With that in mind I took an option on the planing mill equipment in the Reid planing mill at Heppner until March 1st.

Have also been asked to put in a small sawmill in connection with the planing mill so the farmers could bring in logs as short as 8 feet and have them sawed up on the shares. Others have asked to be given the privilege to help saw them up and take lumber for their pay, or help do the building for lumber.

Would you be willing to do the same thing with \$10.00 or more cash? If so, would like to hear from you. I believe this kind of a program would be a benefit to to all—the cash buyer would be able to get his lumber for less, and the others could get lumber for needed improvements by working it out at times they could spare from their other work.

**GARDEN CLUB CHATS**

 It will soon be time to bring a few branches of deutzia, forsythia, spirea or Japanese quince into the house for forcing. Not many branches are needed, the number suggested being either three, five or seven, as any arrangement made of them will necessarily be a line arrangement. The branches could be taken from the shrub where a little pruning would be a benefit. Place the vase in a light window in a cool room until the buds become swollen, then remove to a warmer place keeping a watchful eye on the water, as they will use a surprising amount. These flowers and fresh green leaflets will be so cheerful with their promise of the wealth of bloom to come later that you will be repaid for your trouble.

The zinnia was chosen by vote at the last meeting, to be the official flower for this city and vicinity. Every one is asked to plant some variety this coming season. More improvements have been made in zinnias in the last three years than in the preceding twenty years. One catalog lists fifteen different types ranging in size from the new Cupid variety whose plant is one foot high and blossom one inch across, to the improved California Giants with plants four feet high and blooms seven inches across.
