Swedish ladies have two birthdays, or rather two fete days, a name day and a birthday, to afford their friends a double opportunity for offering them flowers, and their friends never fail to avail themselves of it."

If you are tired of your winter bouquets and potted plants, if the spring sunshine makes you wish for a change, try making dish garden. A neighbor suggests annual phlox as a cover for the tulip bed.
