### GARDEN CLUB CHATS

 This is the fourth in the series of flower show notes planned in cooperation with Mrs. B. A. Doyle, chairman of the flower show committee.

There are three flower arrangements listed in section K in the schedule for the Spring Flower Show. The scale of points to be used in judging these arrangements, and in a general way, the other arrangements listed under this section will be as follows.

Distinction ..... 20%  
 Relation of flowers to container 20%  
 Color harmony ..... 20%  
 Proportion ..... 20%  
 Perfection of arrangement ..... 20%  
 Total ..... 100%

Distinction is very difficult to describe but Mrs. Walter Rhine in her book, "Flower Arrangement," defines it in this way: "To be distinctive an arrangement must be different yet not eccentric."

Relation of flowers to the container is next considered. If the flowers in the arrangement are light in color and delicate in form, fine clear glass is most often used. For flowers more sturdy in form and slightly darker in color, pottery or heavier glass is suggested, while flowers of coarse texture and bold colors belong in containers of heavier materials, such metals as brass or copper often being used.

The booklet published by the National Council of State Garden Clubs defines color harmony as follows: "This is the relation of tones to each other to make a pleasing whole."

Again quoting from the State Garden Club booklet, but this time on proportion: "A rule as to height accepted as being generally the most pleasing is the rule that the arrangement should be one and a half times the height of the container, if it is an upright one, or, if a low broad one, the height is one and a half time the breadth of the container. This is only a general rule and maybe broken for good reason but is good as a guide."

The same booklet under heading of perfection of arrangement gives these hints, "Massed colors are as a rule better than spotty ones. Dark, full-blown or heavy flowers do better at the base of the arrangement, with lighter ones, buds and smaller flowers as you go from the center."

The next meeting will be April 12 and there will be election of officers at this time, Mrs. F. B. Belt, president of the club, asks that all members who can, attend this meeting.

### ANGLERS AWAIT OPENING DAY OF FISHING SEASON

Anglers will come into their own Saturday, April 13, when the 1940 general open angling season, long awaited by hook and line enthusiasts, opens to fishermen through Oregon. The season closes on October 15.

The general bag limit for lakes and streams this year will be 15 pounds and 1 fish but not to exceed 15 fish in any one day, or 30 pounds and 1 fish but not to exceed 30 fish in any seven consecutive days or in possession at any one time.

The six inch limit for trout, in effect for a number of years past, is still in vogue and it is unlawful to take trout under six inches in length.

Restrictions in the coastal tidewater area of a bag limit of cutthroat trout over ten inches to three a day or six in seven consecutive days will be lifted and the general state-wide bag limit will apply to these streams beginning with the opening of the regular season Saturday.

Special regulations apply to certain lakes and streams throughout the state and therefore all anglers are urged to obtain the latest official synopsis of the Oregon Angling Laws from the nearest license agent before setting forth on a fishing trip.

Fees for licenses for residents of Oregon are \$3 a year while non-residents may obtain licenses for \$5 a year. Juvenile angler's license for residents between the ages of 14 and 18 is \$1. A special vacation angler's license for residents and non-residents to angle for a period of two consecutive days will cost \$2.

All fishermen should remember that it is always unlawful: To angle at any time between one hour after sunset and one hour before sunrise; to fish by any means other than with hook and line; to use more than one line or line and rod held in the hand; to use more than two blades on a spinner for lake or stream fishing; to use more than three hooks on a line except on floating base plugs; to sell, or offer for sale or exchange any fish taken with hook and line; to transport or ship game fish without a written permit; to fish without

a license on person; to refuse to show license upon demand; to angle within 200 feet of any fishway; to waste wantonly game fish or allow others to do so; to angle on private lands without permission from the owners; to net, trap, spear, gaff, club or shoot fish; to resist or interfere with the duties of any officer enforcing the game laws; and to fail to make a report to the State Game Commission of all game fish taken during 1939 at the time of making application for the 1940 license.
