FIGURES RELEASED ON SAVINGS BONDS

The local postoffice ranks ninth in the state of Oregon in amount of savings bonds sold during the past year in third class postoffices, according to W. E. Logan, postmaster. In per capita sale the local postoffice ranks 22nd among the more than a hundred third class postoffices in the state.

Secretary of the Treasury Morgenthau announced today that the total sales of savings bonds through March 31, 1940, aggregated in maturity value, more than \$3,860,273,475, and that purchases have been made by approximately 1,987,374 investors. The total represents average purchases of \$2,495,325 for each business day since March 1, 1935, when these bonds were first placed on sale. Deducting bonds redeemed, the maturity value of savings bonds outstanding on March 31, 1940, was approximately \$3,495,573,600.

ness day since March 1, 1935, when these bonds were first placed on sale. Deducting bonds redeemed, the maturity value of savings bonds outstanding on March 31, 1940, was approximately \$3,495,573,600.

The total maturity value of purchases for the calendar year 1939 was \$1,104,060,000, an average purchase for each business day of last year of \$3,667,975.

United States savings bonds are sold on a discount basis and mature in ten years for one-third more than their purchase price. For example, \$75 is the purchase price of a \$100 face value bond, which matures at the end of ten years. Records of the sales for the individual post offices authorized to sell savings bonds are tabulated in cash value.

The attached tabulations show for the year 1939 the cash purchases in the forty cities, towns and villages which led the nation in purchases for last year in their respective post office classifications.

There is also shown for the year the first, second, third and fourth class offices in each state which led in the total cash amount of bonds purchased.

Direct-by-mail and post office purchases from New York, New York, give that city the lead for the nation and for the first class post offices. New York's cash purchases for the period were \$61,116,881.25 (maturity value \$81,489,175).

Glen Ridge, New Jersey, leads the second class post offices, with a cash purchase of \$272,006.25 (maturity value \$362,675). Chaska, Minnesota, leads all third class post offices, having a cash purchase of \$80,887.50 (maturity value \$107,850).

The fourth class post offices are led once again by Plemons, Texas. This town led its class in 1938 with a cash purchase of \$99,627.50 (maturity value \$132,850), and this year it tops its class with the extraordinary amount of \$108,693.75 (maturity value \$144,925).

Approximately 16,000 post offices throughout the country sell United States savings bonds. Regional reports as to annual purchases at each of these offices and mail order purchases originating in their respective territories are being forwarded to the postmasters concerned.
