"Honoring Mother" will be our theme for Sunday morning. We will have no evening service but will attend the baccalaureate service instead.

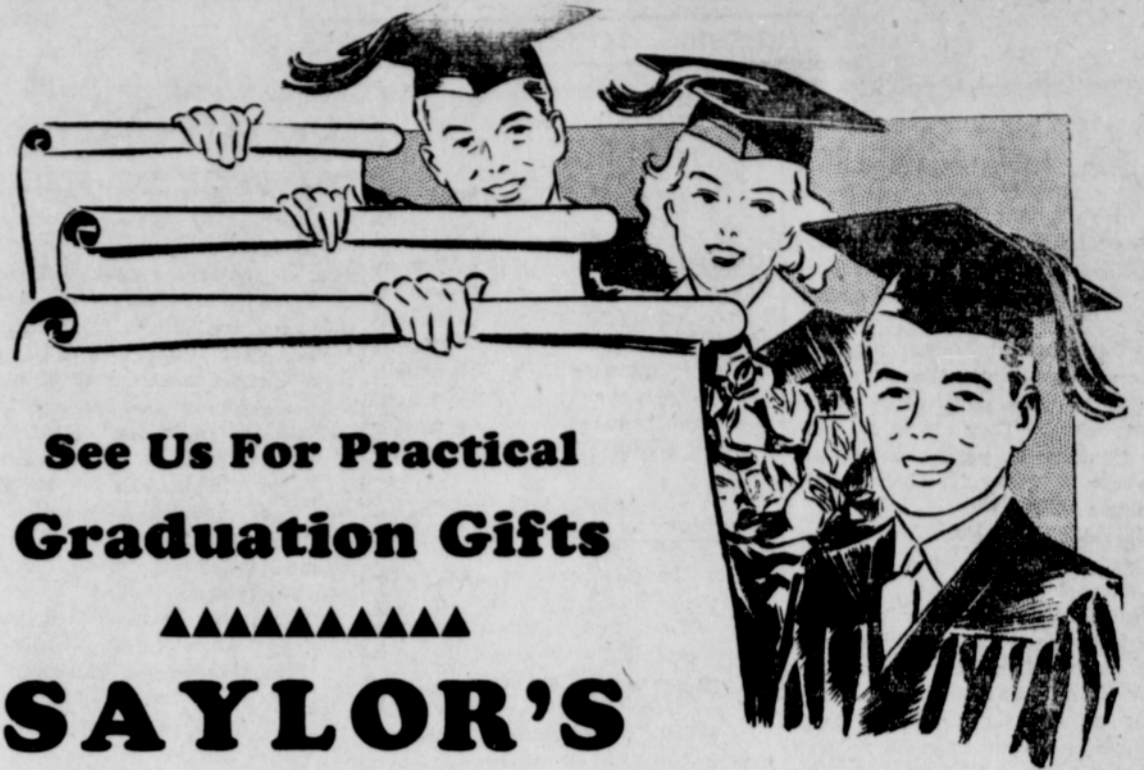

GARDEN CLUB CHATS

If you are doing some wishful thinking about where to go for an afternoon drive the next Sunday, we feel sure the choice will be a happy one if you decide to go to Grandview, Wn., to see the iris garden there. There are 15 acres in the planting, with over 600 named varieties making a rainbow of color. There is no admission and J. J. Miller who is in charge of the garden says that everyone is welcome. The blooms will be at their best on Sunday.

This is a good time of the year to plant clumps of Japanese Iris. An expert tells us to be sure to choose plants that have plump new growth for this indicates that the flower buds have already formed. Japanese iris like plenty of water and a sunny location. They are often used as poolside plantings but may be grown elsewhere in the garden if given plenty of water.

We are told a few days ago by a man who has some very fine snowballs that powdered cloves sprinkled on the ground around the base of the shrub would prevent aphids from infesting them. We have not tried this remedy, but pass it on so that someone may try it and report the result.

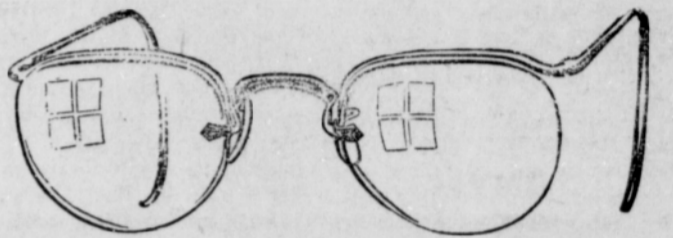
