### FORD TERMINATES GOOD WILL TOUR

On its way up the Pacific coast from the Golden Gate International exposition on Treasure Island, Ford car No. 28,000,000 is due to arrive in the northwest this week on the last lap of a 10,000 mile international goodwill tour, according to A. F. Rohrman, local Ford dealer. At the wheel of the historic 28,

000,000th Ford, now en route to the Pacific Northwest, are veteran copilots Jimmy Rooney and Charles Soderquist, who have been on the road through the southern states and Mexico since April 9th, when the car was wished bon voyage at the Ford plant in Edgewater, New Jersey. Present at the gala send-off ceremonies were Edsel Ford, Governor Moore of New Jersey, the Canadian Trade Commissioner and the Mexican Consul.

After a series of civic welcomes en route through the southern states, Ford No. 28,000,000 entered Mexico City, where interchanges of goodwill were made. The car then proceeded west to the San Francisco World's Fair where it was given a colorful reception in the Court of Pacifica in front of the Ford building, as a part of the May 25 opening day festivities.

Civic dignitaries and officials will welcome the car and sign the colorful log book in each Pacific Northwest community where it calls. On completion of its northwest itinerary, this significant automobile will enter Canada to participate in a big international reception.
