LETTER TO EDITOR

In my item in the Herald last week it was stated that if commercial rates in Hermiston were as low as those of Forest Grove or Canby Oregon, the saving of power cost at the Farm Bureau Cooperative during the month of July would have been \$122.00 on a 9000 K. W. H. use.

Bonneville power is delivered anywhere in the northwest for the same price. Umatilla county and its communities are no exception. It perhaps should be emphasized that the rates so established at Forest Grove, for instance, carry with them ample provision for taxes, depreciation and operating costs. In addition to the above these rates provided a net return of 23.3 for each dollar of electric revenue.

However, coming close to home again our cooperative creamery in Hermiston used 13,500 K. W. H. during the month of July. The power cost was \$271.00. Under the rates mentioned above and recommended by Dr. Raver, the Bonneville Power Administrator. The cost would be \$117.50 or \$153.50 less.

The Co-op creamery received over 55,000 pounds of butterfat during the month of July. The difference in power cost would almost be three-tenths of one cent per pound butterfat, a handsome dividend to a producer of 1000th lb. of butterfat. The facing and meeting of costs that are unnecessarily high should always receive serious consideration, and some solution is the inevitable result.

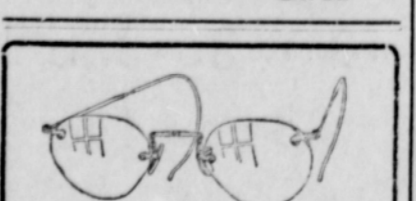

THOUSANDS OF 4-H CLUB MEMBERS EYE STATE FAIR

Upwards of 200 4-H club members will attend this year's state fair, starting on Labor day, September 2, as active participants, according to estimates by the state club office at Oregon State college. These will be attending as exhibitors or members of demonstration groups or judging teams. While the 4-H dormitory on the grounds accommodates only about 500 at a time, attendance will be staggered throughout the week so that most of the clubbers will be housed there.

Major contest interest this year is centering around the dairy production and dairy consumption demonstration teams. State winners in these contests will be given an expense-free trip to the National Dairy show in Harrisburg, Pa., this fall.

Between 700 and 750 4-H club livestock exhibits are expected at this year's fair. The second annual livestock auction will be held following the judging, at which around 250 head of commercial baby beeves, lambs, and hogs will be sold.
