HORSE LOSSES SHOW VALUE OF VACCINE

An aggravated recurrence of brain fever or sleeping sickness in horses in the Hermiston district in early August furnishes convincing argument for and proof of the value of vaccine, reports Dr. W. H. Lytle, chief of the state department of agriculture division of animal industry.
Late in July and early August about three cases appeared daily in that district, and virtually all in unvaccinated animals. Early this year about 800 horses were vaccinated in that area under a voluntary program conducted by the department and the Umatilla county agent's office. The vaccine cost was about 40 cents a head.

MORE CO-OP. HOUSES TO BE RUN BY O. S. C. STUDENTS

Oregon State College—More cooperative houses than ever before will be operated here this year to accommodate students seeking a college education at lowest possible cost. Four men's cooperatives with a combined capacity of close to 100 students will be operated, compared with three last year, and seven women's cooperatives will be in service instead of the five last year, accommodating about 170.

The increased number of women applying for entrance at Oregon State this year brought so many requests for admission to cooperative houses that two new ones have just been arranged. With students doing most of their own work in these houses, the cost of board and room does not exceed \$20 a month.

E. B. Lemon, registrar, has received many inquiries from men students regarding enrollment in view of the possible national defense demands. In reply he is passing on to them President Roosevelt's recent statement that "It is their patriotic duty to continue the normal course of their education unless or until they are called."

He is also calling attention to the availability of thorough military training in the R.O.T.C. in connection with college work.

DANGER STRESSED BY CITY COUNCIL

(Continued from Page 1)
Section 5. Every person riding or operating a bicycle on any street, alley or public place in the City of Hermiston shall keep said bicycle on the extreme right of the traffic lane, and it shall be unlawful for two or more riders or operators of bicycles to travel abreast or to ride or operate a bicycle otherwise than in single file.

Section 6. It shall be unlawful to engage in bicycle racing upon the streets or alleys of the City of Hermiston.

Section 7. No operator or owner of a bicycle shall leave his bicycle on any sidewalk in the City of Hermiston or placed in such a manner as to hinder or impede pedestrian or vehicular traffic.

Section 8. Any person violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall, upon conviction thereof before the City Recorder, be punished by impounding his bicycle in the office of the City Recorder for such period as the City Recorder shall designate.

Section 9. Every person riding or operating a bicycle upon any street, alley or public place in the City of Hermiston shall be subject to all the provisions of the laws of the State of Oregon and ordinances of the City applicable to the drivers of vehicles.

Section 10. Whereas bicycles are now being operated in the City of Hermiston without sufficient regulation, endangering the riders and other persons it is necessary that this ordinance be in effect immediately for the preservation of the peace, health and safety of the City, this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Council and approval by the Mayor.

Passed the Council this 4 day of September, 1940, by the affirmative vote of five Councilmen.
