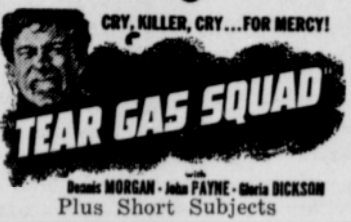

Mrs. Neill Boynton returned Saturday from The Dalles hospital where she has spent the past six weeks. She is greatly improved.

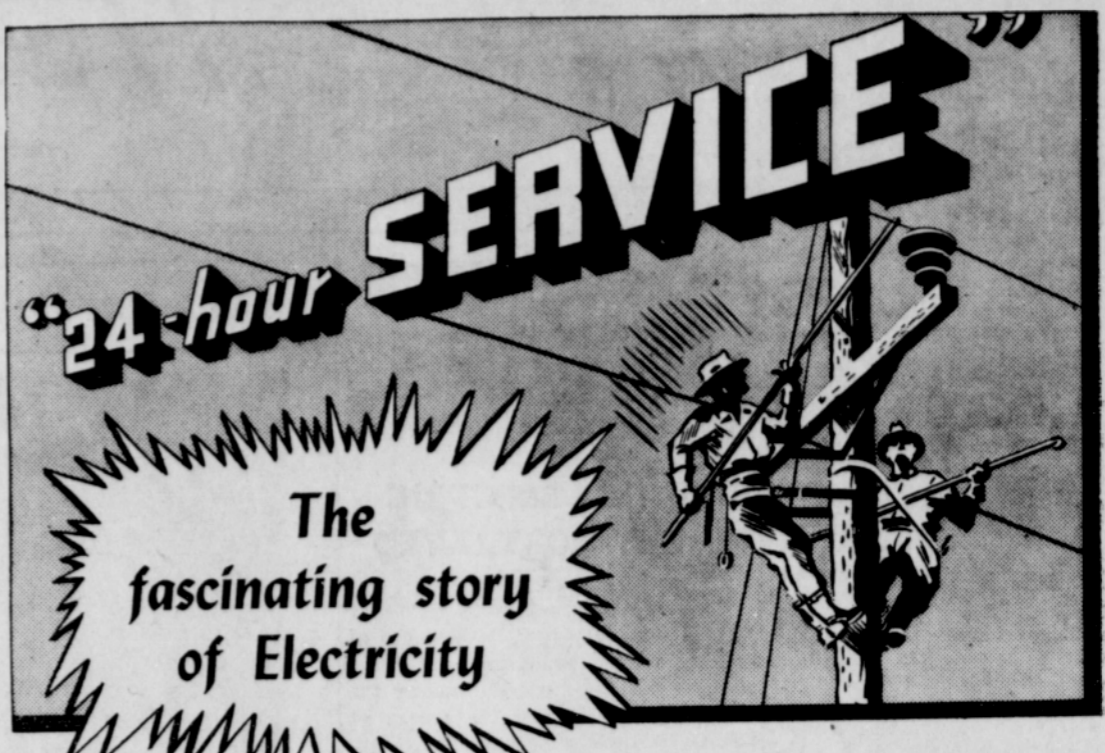
Members of the Methodist church ladies aid will meet Wednesday for an all-day meeting for clean-up purposes.
