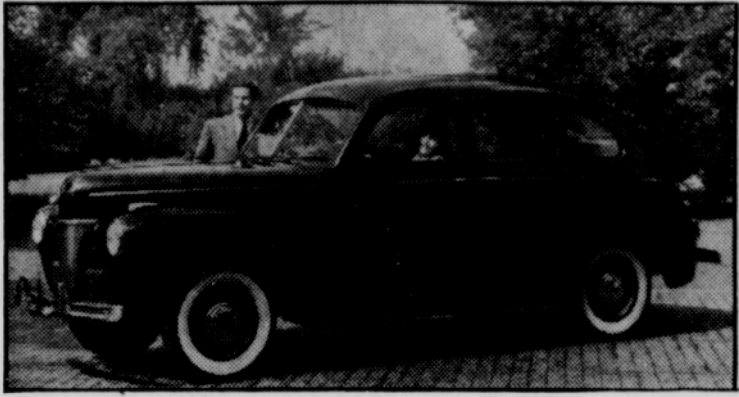
**REPORT ON MILK CONTROL BY OSC MEN IS PUBLISHED**

The success of economic control of the milk industry must be measured in terms of the improvement in the quality of milk and the extent to which the efficiency of the industry has increased, according to conclusions reached by experiment station economists at Oregon State college, who have been conducting county-by-county surveys on the operation of the Oregon milk control law. A summary of their findings has just been published in the form of station bulletin No. 375, entitled "Some Economic Implications of Milk Control in Oregon."

The report makes no attempt to decide for or against the milk control law as regards its various activities in this state. It does analyze the effects of the law in the counties and points out the relationship of various board actions to subsequent developments in the fluid milk industry.

The authors, Dr. D. B. DeLoach and William A. West, also point out that success or failure of the milk control board should not be measured in terms of its individual actions, but rather in terms of progress made toward bringing the desired economic stability to the industry, and toward accomplishment of the other social objectives of the act.

**BETTER PROSPECT APPROACHING FOR ANIMAL PRODUCTS**

A more favorable outlook for the 1940-41 marketing season than for the longer period is the general prospect for poultry, dairy and livestock products, according to the annual outlook report for these farm products just published by the Oregon State college extension service. One of the principal favorable factors is the relatively strong domestic demand situation which is expected to pre-

vail through much or all of the 1940-41 marketing year.

Supplies of eggs and of pork are not expected to be as large during the year ahead as during the past marketing season, but the volume of dairy products, beef and lamb is expected to hold up around that of the past year. Cattle numbers, both dairy and beef, are increasing enough to make the outlook ahead less favorable for dairy products and beef. Future price trends, while indefinite owing to war, are likely to be adverse if the cattle cycle operates as in the past.

The report contains sections on feeds and costs, demand, and several tables of data of value to producers in planning their production and marketing operations. A copy may be had free from county agents or direct from the college.
